This year will be the same but at a higher scale of expectation as we continue to learn and grow.

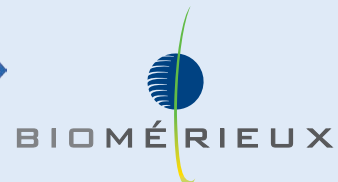
